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GENERAL TECHNICAL RULES

1

TIME AND DURATION

The 55th International Children's Games will take place from July 5 to July 10, 2023 in Daegu, Republic of Korea.

PROGRAMME

The program of the 55th International Children's Games includes the following disciplines:

SUMMER SPORTS

- **TEAM SPORTS:** Volleyball, Football(Soccer), Basketball(3x3)
- **INDIVIDUAL SPORTS:** Athletics, Swimming, Taekwondo, Tennis, Table tennis

For team sports, and combat sports each team or individual must have 2 different colors of sport uniform.

PARTICIPANTS

- **DELEGATES:** A maximum of 24 (18 athletes and 4coaches), a minimum of 10 (7 athletes and 3 coaches)
- Participating athletes must reside or attend school in the city in which they represent.
- Athletes must be 12 years old by January 1 the year of the Games and must still be 15 years old, on December 31 the year of the Games.

3

IDENTITY CARD, CONTROL AND SANCTIONS

- All participants of the Games (athletes, coaches, other participants) need to have identification cards, made by the organizer of the Games. The ID card has to include the Participant's photo, sports, the First and last name, City and Country.
- The Head of Delegation is obliged to give the accurate data for the ID cards.The Head of Delegation may need to make access available to all information including legal documentation on their team, in case of any complaint or issues. It is therefore advisable to bring copies of all documentation to the Games.
- In the case of fraud, the City will be obliged to pay all penalty expenses and fines imposed by the Executive Committee of ICG.
- The Referee of appointed discipline as well as the Head of Competition must inspect the athlete's ID card before commencing the competition.
- All athletes must show their accreditation cards with a photo; without this card an athlete cannot compete.

TECHNICAL MEETINGS

- Joint technical meeting for all disciplines will take place at least a day before the technical meeting of individual disciplines. At the meeting the Heads of Competition and the members of ICG TC will take part.
- Before the beginning of competition, the technical meeting of individual disciplines is summoned. At the meeting the Heads of Competition and the members of ICG TC as well as the coaches will take part.

AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION

- A Head of Delegation may file a sport protest. To do so they will follow the Sport Protest procedure for the International Children's Games.
- All sport protests will be heard and either denied or investigated by the ICG Protest Committee.

The Protest Committee members are:

- Representative of the host city
- Vice president of ICG
- Member of ICG TC
- Head of referee of the sport
- Referee of the sport (Invited members)

- All decisions by the Protest Committee are final and binding.
- Sports Protests must be initiated, in writing, by the City's Head of Delegation, as soon as possible after the incident, which is the subject of the protest. The protest must provide the details necessary for the Committee's review and should be submitted to the Head Referee for that sport or any one of the Protest Committee members.
- All protests require a 100 Euros (or equivalent other currency) protest fee to be paid to the ICG before a protest will be heard. Only one protest by a city's Head of Delegation can be filed per sport incident.
- If the Head of Delegation refuses, or is unable to submit a protest in writing, the Protest Committee may exercise its discretion and investigate the protest.
- Subject to any limits imposed either by law or by this procedure, information (whether oral or written) which is created, gathered, received, or compiled through the course of an investigation will be treated as confidential by all involved in the investigation and adjudication of the protest.

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DISCIPLINARY RULES

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be adhered to at all times. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behavior, offence made through words and/or actions, violent behavior, and abusive language.
- All delegations have to comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.
- Coaches are responsible for the well-being and behavior of their athletes at all times.

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PRESENTATION OF MEDALS

- The following Medals will be awarded:
 - Gold: For individuals and relay teams ranking first place in the competition.
 - Silver: For individuals and relay teams ranking second place in the competition.
 - **Bronze:** For individuals and relay teams ranking third place in the competition.
- Medals will only be awarded to the first three athletes/teams in the A Finals.
- Medal presentations will be made at designated times as per schedule.
Athletes must wear their competition uniform or team tracksuit for the ceremony. Team coaches are requested to assist in ensuring athletes are readily available and correctly dressed.

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MEDICAL

First aid will be available on site. At this first aid station, a doctor, a nurse, a physical therapist and an ambulance will be present and available for all participants.

Serious cases will be referred to Keimyung University Dongsan Hospital.

Track & Field - Athletics

Date of competition 7th - 9th July 2023



1. TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

2. VENUE

- Daegu Stadium (180 Universiad-ro, Suseong-gu)

3. IDENTIFICATION

- All athletes must show their accreditation cards with a photo; without this card an athlete cannot compete.

4. COMPETITION RULES

- Each city may register a maximum number of 8 girls and 8 boys and a minimum of 2 girls and 2 boys.
- Maximum 2 athletes from each team are allowed to participate in one event.
- Each athlete may compete in two events and TWO RELAY (4 x 100m, mix 4 x 100m).
- Girls running 800m and boys running 1500m are not allowed to compete in any other discipline the same day of their middle distance competition (except for the relay).
- Athletics events
 - Running events : 100m, 400m, 800m (girls only), 1500m (boys only), 4x100m relay, 4x100m-mix relay(2boys+2girls)
 - Jumping and throwing events: long jump, high jump, shot put
- Number of coaches: One for each boy's team, one for each girl's team.
- Personal best performance from each athlete will be required during registration for seeding purposes.
- Uniforms: Athletes must wear the uniform of their city.
- Competition numbers will be given to Team Managers/Coaches, who will be responsible for issuing bib numbers to all athletes in their team. The competition numbers must be worn firmly attached to the front and the back of the uniform with no less than four (4) pins so that the entire number and logo can be easily seen. No part of the number can be folded.

- Hip numbers will be provided by an official at the start of events requiring them.
- If an athlete fails to scratch from an event after confirmation, she/he may not be permitted to compete in any other event in the Games including relays (See IAAF Rule 142.4)
- The competition will take place according to IAAF Rules and ICG Rules.

5. CALL ROOM

- There will be a call room in operation.
- All athletes must report to the call room on time with their competition numbers attached to their uniform.
- In the call room athletes will be expected to demonstrate that their competition uniform, singlet and numbers, shoes and other equipment comply with the completion rules.
- Please do not take unnecessary items into the call room like mobile phones, ipods etc. as they will be confiscated.
- Athletes will proceed to the start of their event from the call room ACCOMPANIED BY A CALL ROOM JUDGE OR FIELD EVENT OFFICIAL. Athletes who proceed to the event not accompanied by a judge or official may not be allowed to start.
- The closing Call Entry Times at the call room are: (prior to scheduled event starting times)
 - Running events: 30 mins
 - Jumping and throwing events: 40 mins
- The composition of a team and the order of running for a relay shall be officially declared 90mins prior to relay scheduled event starting times.
- This time allows for marshaling and movements to the competition site. The remainder of the time may be used to complete the warm up at the competition site where the competition site is not in use (under supervision of the officials).
- If an athlete is already, or is likely to be, competing in another event at the designated call time, the athlete or his/her team official must notify the Call Room of this circumstance prior to the designated call time.
- Athletes who will fail to be at the call room on time will be suspended!
- Warm up: Athletes may warm up in the designated area.
- Starting Blocks: must be used by all athletes in the 100m, 400m, 100m hurdles, 80m hurdles and relay. These will be supplied by the venue. No private blocks will be permitted.
- False start: Each athlete responsible for a false start will be disqualified (IAAF 162.7.)
- Shoes : The sole and heel of the shoe may be constructed so as to provide for the use of up to 11 spikes.

The maximum length of spikes should be allowed no longer than 9 mm, except for high jump and javelin throwing, and javelin throwing where it is often allowed to use spikes up 12mm. The spike must be so designed

that it will, at least for the half of its length close to the tip of the spike, fit through a square 4 mm gauge.

6. QUALIFICATION

6.1 100m

- Qualification: 8 heats, the first place of each heat and the 16 fastest runners for semi-final.
- 24 runners will advance to the semi-final. Advancement procedures will be set upon receipt of final entries.
- Semi-final: 3 heats, the first two places from each heat, and the two fastest runners will progress to the A final, and the second eight fastest runners will progress to the B final.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

6.2 400m

- Qualification: - If the total number of participating is less than 32, then first place of each heat and the 4 fastest runners for final A and the next 8 fastest runners will progress to the final B. - If the total number of teams participating is greater than 32, then 8 fastest runners for final A and the next 8 fastest runners will progress to the final B.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

6.3 800m (girls only)

- Qualification: 6 heats, the first place of each heat and 2 fastest runners will progress to the final A, and the next eight fastest runners will progress to the final B.
- Girls participating in the 800m run are not entitled to participate in another event on the same day.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

6.4 1500m (boys only)

- Qualification: 5 heats, the first two places of each heat and 2 fastest runners will progress to the final A, and the next eight fastest runners will progress to the final B.
- Boys participating in the 1500m run are not entitled to participate in another event on the same day.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

6.5 Long Jump

- Qualification standard: Girls 5.00m, Boys 5.80m
- Qualification: Each athlete has three attempts. All competitors who reach or exceed the qualification standard will progress to the final. If less than 12 athletes reach the qualification standard, the 12 best performances of qualification groups will progress to the final.
- Final: The best 8 athletes after three attempts will have three further attempts.

6.6 High Jump

- Qualification standard: Girls 1.50m, Boys 1.65m
- Qualification: All the competitors who will clear the above-mentioned qualifying standard reach the final. If less than 12 competitors jump the standard, the next best athletes in order will progress the final (until the number of 12 competitors is reached).
- The heights for the qualifications
Girls: 1.30, 1.35, 1.40, 1.45, 1.50
Boys: 1.45, 1.50, 1.55, 1.60, 1.65
- The heights for the final
Girls: 1.40, 1.45, 1.50, 1.55, +3 cm
Boys: 1.55, 1.60, 1.65, 1.70, 1.75, +3cm

6.7 Shot Put

- The shot weights are:
Boys: 5 kg
Girls: 3kg
- Shots will be provided by the organizers. For athletes wishing to use their own shot, the implement must be lodged with the Technical Manager at the equipment room by 9:00am on the day of competition in which your event is to be held. The implements will be impounded until after the competition when athletes may collect them from the equipment room. Any competitor may use all implements in the pool.
- Qualification standard: Girls 10.00m, Boys 12.00m
- Qualification: Each athlete has three attempts. All competitors who reach or exceed the qualification standard will progress to the final. If less than 12 athletes reach the qualification standard, the 12 best performances of qualification groups will progress to the final.
- Final: The best 8 athletes after three attempts will have three further attempts.

6.8 4x100m Relay

- If the total number of teams participating in 4x100m Relay is less than 32, semi-finals be not organized and the first place of each heat and the 4 fastest runners for final A and the next 8 fastest runners will progress to the final B. If the total number of teams participating is greater than 32, then: 24 teams will advance to the semi-final - the first place of each heat and the fastest runners.
- Semi-final: 3 heats, the first two places from each heat, and the two fastest runners will progress to the A final, and the second eight fastest runners will progress to the B final.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

6.9 4x100m Mix Relay

2 boys + 2 girls - free placement of participants instages]

- First place of each heat and the 4 fastest runners for final A and the next 8 fastest runners will progress to the final B.

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be adhered to at all times. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behavior, offence made through words and/or actions, violent behavior, and abusive language.
- All delegations have to comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.

2. VENUE

- Duryu Swimming Pool (237 Gongwonsunhwan-ro, Dalseo-gu)

3. COMPETITION INFORMATION

- Swimmers may compete in 4 events plus 2 relays.
- There will be the following competitions:
 - 50m, 100m, 200m, 400m Freestyle
 - 50m, 100m, 200m Backstroke
 - 50m, 100m, 200m Breaststroke
 - 50m, 100m, 200m Butterfly
 - 200m Individual Medley
 - 4 x100m Freestyle Relay
 - 4 x100m Medley Relay
 - 4x100m mixed medley Relay (2male, 2female)
- Each city may enter a maximum of 4 boys and 4 girls and minimum 2 boys and 2 girls. (2+0, 2+0, minimum two athletes and one coach)
- Cities can enter a maximum of 2 swimmers per event.
- Swimmers must supply personal best performance times for each event during registration process.
- The pool is an indoor 50m lane facility. The warm-up pool is an indoor 25m lane facility.
- Electronic timing and lane display scoreboard will be in use.
- Participant seating will be in the grandstand.
- One coach per city is allowed.
- One coach per city is allowed.

4. COMPETITION RULES

- The meet will take place according to FINA and ICG rules.
- Racing suits are required for all competitors. Swimwear must comply with current FINA regulation.
- No dives or jumps are allowed unless in designated lanes opened up by the officials or meet director.
- Athletes will be provided with full pool access for warm up at least 60 minutes prior to the first race commencing.
- A and B Finals will take place in all 50m and 100m events. Medals will only be awarded to the first three athletes/teams in 'A' Finals.
- Coaches must send personal best times for appropriate allotment of lanes.

Basketball 3 on 3 (Streetball)

Date of competition 7th - 9th July 2023



1. TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

2. VENUE

- Hyoseong Girl's High School (48 Wolgok-ro 94-gil, Dalseo-gu)

3. COURT

- The game will be played on a court (size 15x11) playing with one (1) basket.
- The court shall have a regular basketball playing court sized zone, including a free throw line (5.80m), a two point line (6.75m) and a no-charge semi-circle area underneath the one basket.

4. COMPETITION INFORMATION

4.1 Teams

- Number of teams that can participate: 24 Boys teams and 24 Girls teams.
- Each team shall consist of a maximum of four (4) players (3 players on the court and 1 substitute) and one (1) coach.
- Number of coaches: One (1) for Boys team & One (1) for Girls team.

4.2 Points

- Basket made from within the 2-point area (inside the 3-point line arc) = 1 point.
- Free throw = 1 point.
- Basket made from the 3-point shot area (beyond the 3-point line arc) = 2 points.

4.3 Game Officials

- The game officials shall be one (1) referee assisted by three (3) table officials, namely a scorer, a timer and a twelve (12) second operator.

4.4 Basketball Apparel

- Basketball Teams must have a minimum of two sets of shirts as well as basketball shoes, socks, shorts, t-shirt. All equipment used by players must be appropriate for the game.

4.5 Ball Size

- Any equipment that is designed to increase a players' height or reach or in any other way give an unfair advantage is not permitted.

4.6 Beginning of the Game

- 6 for boys and 6 for girls or official FIBA 3 on 3 ball
- Both teams shall warm-up (3 minutes) simultaneously.
- Before the game, a player from team A will take a 3-point shot. If made, team A shall begin.
- The game with a throw-in, if not, it will be team B. The team that did not start the game.

4.7 Playing Time/Winner of a Game

- The regular playing time shall be 12 min (10 min not include stopping time + 2 last min include stopping time).
- The clock shall be stopped during dead ball situations and free throws. The clock shall be restarted after the exchange of the ball is completed (as soon as it is in the offensive team's hands).
- However the first team which scores 21 or more points wins the game if it happens before the end of a regular playing time. This rule applies to regular playing time only (not in a potential overtime).
- If the score is tied at the end of playing time, an extra period of time will be played. There shall be an Interval of one (1) minute before the overtime starts. The first team to score two (2) points in the overtime wins the game.

4.8 Fouls by Player/Fouls by Team

- A team is in a team foul situation when it has committed seven (7) fouls.
- A player who has committed four (4) fouls must leave the game.
- Fouls during the act of shooting inside the arc shall be awarded with one (1) free throw.
- Fouls during the act of shooting behind the arc shall be awarded with two (2) free throws.
- Fouls during the act of shooting followed by a successful field goal shall be awarded one (1) additional free-throw.
- Non-shooting fouls under penalty foul situation shall be awarded with one (1) free throw.
- In case of a technical foul, the penalty will be one (1) shoot and possession.
- In case of an unsportsmanlike foul, the penalty will be two (2) shots and possession.

4.9 Twelve Second Device

- The team must attempt a shot for a field goal within 12 seconds.
- The 12 second clock will be reset only when there is a foul or foot violation.

4.10 Stalling

- Stalling or failing to play actively by attempting to score shall be a violation.
- A team must attempt a shot within twelve (12) seconds. The game starts only after basket was scored over the 3 point's line and not underneath the basket.
- If the court is not equipped with a shot clock and a team is not sufficiently trying to attack the basket, the referee shall give them a warning by counting the last 5 seconds.

4.11 How the Ball Is Played

- Following each successful field goal or last free throw:
- A player from a non-scoring team will resume the game by passing the ball from the place directly from the court underneath the basket (not from behind the end line) to his teammate to any place on the court. However, if that place is not behind the three-point line, the ball receiver must dribble/pass the ball to a place on the court behind the three-point line.
- Following each unsuccessful field goal or last free throw:
- If the offensive team rebound the ball, it may continue to attempt the score without returning the ball to behind the three-point line.
- If the defensive team rebound the ball, it must return the ball (by passing or dribbling) behind the three-point line.
- Once the ball is behind the three-point line at least one additional pass must be made to a teammate before an attempt to score is made.
- Following the steal, turnover etc:
- If it happens within the two-point area, the ball must be passed/dribbled to a place behind the three-point line. Once the ball is behind the three-point line, at least one additional pass must be made to a teammate before the attempt to score is made.
- Should the first offensive player who has dribbled/received the ball at a place behind the three-point line attempt to score, it is a violation.
- All throw-ins following the fouls (without free throws), violations, out-of bounds, at the beginning of the first period and of the extra period shall be taken from the out-of-bounds place level with the top of the three-point line, closest to the infraction. The places shall be marked in out-of-bounds by 5cm line. The referee shall hand the ball to the out-of-bound player. The thrower-in must pass the ball to his teammate to any place on the court. However, if that place is not behind the three-point, the ball receiver must dribble/pass the ball to a place on the court behind the three-point line.
- Dunking of the ball is not permitted unless pressure-released rings are used.

4.12 Substitutions

- The substitution shall be permitted when the ball becomes dead and the game clock is stopped.

4.13 Time-outs

- There are no time-outs granted to any team at any time.

5. ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

- All the teams must be at the court 45 minutes before the designated fixture.
- Teams (Coaches, Players) should arrive at basketball venue with the necessary accreditation. All delegation must comply with any indication made by the venue staff, without creating any kind of problem to other teams. For any issue or protest, the Head of Delegation has to contact the competition manager immediately. If anything negative is observed, we request immediate report to the department responsible person.

6. DISCIPLINARY RULES

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be adhered to at all times. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behaviour, offence made through words and/or actions, violent behaviour, and abusive language.
- All delegations have to comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.
- Coaches are responsible for the well-being and behaviour of their athletes at all times.

- A team consists of between 6 and (maximum) 8 players.
- Number of teams that can participate: 8 boys teams and 8 girls teams.
- One coach per squad.
- Numbered jerseys in unison color must be worn by all team members.
- Players are not permitted to wear head/sweat bands not approved by Head Referee
- Net height is for boys 230 cm and girls 220 cm.
- Matches will be played with the official ball.
- There will be separate tournaments for girls and boys: 6-a-side.
- Each team must play with exactly 6 players on side.
- All athletes must be able to show their identification card. When unable to show the identification card, participation is not possible.
- Depending on the number of entries, teams will be entered into pools of up to 4 teams.
- Preliminary rounds (Group Stage–League System)
 - Each team will play all other team in their group once.
 - Boy's tournament: 8 teams will be divided into 2 groups.
 - Girl's tournament: 8 teams will be divided into 2 groups.
 - Two points will be awarded for a win, one point for a loss and zero point for a withdrawal.
 - The team ranking first place in each group will advance to semi-finals.
 - In the case of the teams in the same pool have the same number of points, the final standings will be decided by the following order:
 - Head to head between the teams concerned.

- Set difference - the greater - resulting from the group matches ONLY between the teams concerned.
- Greater number of set won in all group matches ONLY between the teams concerned.
- Lowest number of set lost all group matches ONLY between the teams Concerned.
- If still undecided, the winner will be decided by a coin flip by the head referee.
- Final rounds (Knock-out Stage):
 - Allocation draw for semi-final will be held after preliminary round of all groups finished.
 - The semi-finals will be between the 4 group winners.
 - The final will be between 2 semi-finals winners.
- All the players must be in the venue 50 minutes before the designated fixture.

4. COMPETITION RULES

- The regulations of the International Volleyball Federation (FIVB) are leading in the races.
- The match is played in two sets won by 25 points, with a possible third set up to 15 points.
- Sets must be won by two points difference.
- Match will be played with the official game ball designated by the organizer, STAR(Korean official game ball, suitable for international standards).
 - ball size : 5(650–670mm) / weight : 260–280g / material : polyurethan
- A ball is “in” when the imprint of the ball is visible on the line.
- A team may have three contacts with the ball. After the third contact, the ball must be played to the opponent.

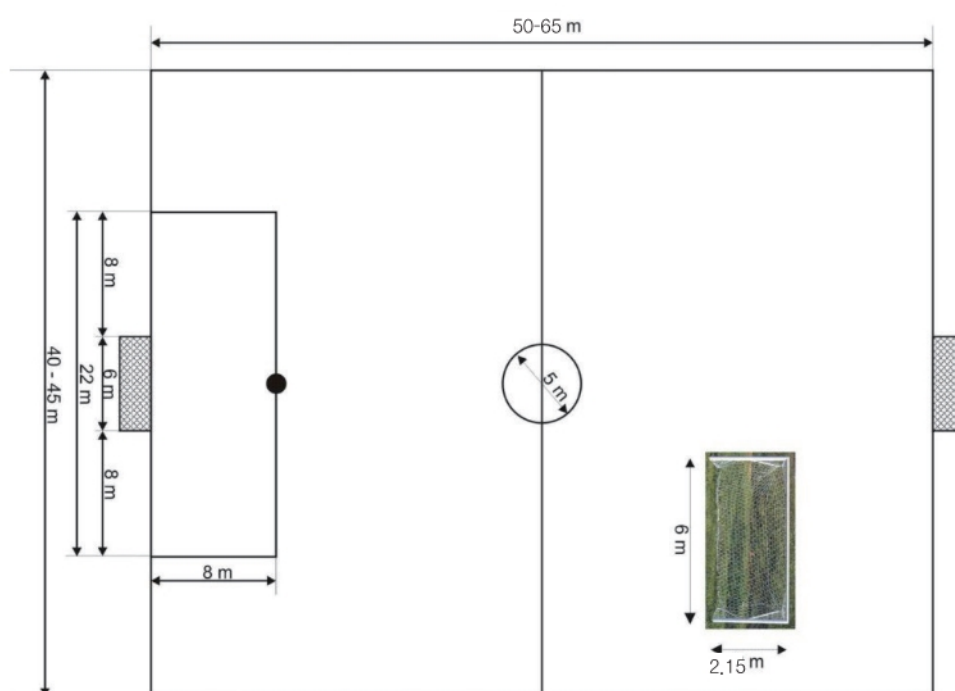
3. COMPETITION INFORMATION

- There will be separate tournaments for girls and boys teams.
- One coach per team is allowed.
- Teams will consist of 6-8 players 1 of which will be a goalkeeper.
- Number of teams that can participate: 16 boys teams and 8 girls teams.
- Both the boy's team and the girl's team have a separate coach.
- Shin guards are required for all competitors.
- The venue is outdoors and will be played on artificial grass. Players must wear proper soccer cleats/shoes/boots. (Baseball type cleats are not allowed).
- Athletes are prohibited to wear neither any footwear with metal studs nor glasses/sunglasses during a game unless sports/plastic/protective glasses.

4. COMPETITION RULES

- The rules of the tournament will be FIFA rules modified for small-sided games.
- Depending on the number of entries, teams will be entered into pools of up to 4 teams.
- The pitch size will be 50-65m by 40-45m.
- No offside rule will be operated.
- The ball used will be a size 5.

- Each game will consist of 2 halves of 20 minutes each. Half-time break is 5 minutes.
- Warm up duration: 10 minutes.
- Team size consists of 6 players: (5 players that includes 1 Captain) and 1 goalkeeper.
- Goal length 4.8-6m and height 1.9-2.15m.
- Competitions within group are led by 1 referee. Quarter finals, semifinals and final game will be led by 2 referees.
- A system of rolling substitutions will apply.
- A timekeeper is required, controlling the duration of the games, using a horn/hooter as no injury time is allowed, except in the Final, which is at the discretion of the referee(s).
- The area between pitches should be kept clear for teams and officials only, with spectators viewing only from the opposite side.
- Throw-ins are allowed.
- Slide tackles are not allowed (punishable with a yellow card), but sliding to score, or to stop the ball going out of play or to stop a goal, is allowed.
- Goalkeepers can kick from the hand only after catching the ball.
- The Head Referee cannot become involved with refereeing decisions made on the field of play.
- The normal football back-pass rule applies.
- Goals cannot be scored directly from a kick-off.
- A team does not show up for their first game will be disqualified from the tournament but allowed to play the scheduled fixtures as "friendlies" at the discretion of the Tournament Director and the opposing teams.
- All team members wear the same football strip.



6. PRELIMINARY ROUNDS

- Each team will play all other teams in their pool once. Depending on the pool size and structure, the top teams will go forward to the Medal Rounds while the remaining teams will play an additional consolation game.
- In pool games, 3 points will be awarded for a win and 1 point for a draw.
- The top 2 teams in each group will advance to the quarter finals.
- In the case that teams in the same pool have the same number of points, the final standings will be decided by the following order:
 1. Head to head between the teams concerned.
 2. Goal difference resulting from the group matches ONLY between the teams concerned;
 3. Greater number of goals scored in all group matches ONLY between the teams concerned;
 4. Lower number of goals against in all group matches ONLY between the teams concerned;
 5. If still undecided, the winner will be decided by a coin flip by the Head Referee.

6. MEDAL ROUND

- The quarter-finals will be between the top teams in the Pool Round. The winners of one pool will play against the runner up in the another pool.
- The Semi-finals will be between the 4 quarter-finals winners.
- The final will be between the 2 semi-final winners.
- In the event of a draw at quarter-final, semi-final or final games it goes straight to penalties, any 5 from the full squad can take the first 5 penalties before moving to the rest of the squad if required. Squads for penalties shall be determined by the team with the lower number of players. The goalkeeper who finished the game must be in goal for at least the first penalty.

7. DISCIPLINARY RULES

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be adhered to at all times. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behaviour, offence made through words and/or actions, violent behaviour, and abusive language.
- All delegations have to comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.
- Coaches are responsible for the well-being and behaviour of their athletes at all times.
- Player who receives a yellow card will be sent to the bench for two minutes. The 2 minutes start after play resumes.
Typical yellow card offences include:
Unsporting behavior, dissent by words or actions

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- Players sent off (red card) for any reason will be suspended for the team's next game. Typical red card offences include: Serious foul-play, violent conduct, abusive language.
 - If a team is **permanently** reduced to 4 players due to sending offs, the game will end and the match will be awarded 2-0 to their opponents, unless the score, as it stands at that point, is more advantageous to their opponents.

3. COMPETITION INFORMATION

- Number of coaches: One for every team.
- Number of athletes: minimum 2 players – maximum two per gender.
Maximum number of athletes: 32 per gender
- Maximum number of teams: 16 per gender
- The tournament will begin with first (1st) for singles main draw on July 7 and will end on July 10 with the finals for doubles and the finals for singles main draw at the Tennis Venue.
- 8 hard surface courts. 8 courts appropriate for singles and doubles matches.
- Two singles draws of 32 participants for boys and girls. Two doubles draws of 16 teams for boys and girls.
- Preliminary round(Group Stage-League System)
 - Players will be divided into 8 groups of 4 players.
 - Each team will play all other teams in their group once.
 - Single match: 32 players will be divided into 8 groups.
 - Double match: 16 teams will be divided into 4 groups.
 - The team ranking first place in each group will advance to the quarterfinals.
- For the needs of training, the athletes will be able to use the same courts or another one on July 6.
- All equipment used by players must be appropriate for the match according to the I.T.F. regulations.
- In the event of rain, number of competition is subject to change.

4. COMPETITION RULES

- Playing court size will be 23,77m X 8,23m for singles.
- Playing court size will be 23,77m X 10,97m for doubles.

- Matches will be played with official balls Head Championship.
- Each singles match will be played in a best-of-three sets format. In the event the set reaches 6-6, a tie-break to 7 points with a difference of 2 points should be played in the first 2 sets. In the event the sets are drawn 1-1, then a super tiebreaker should be played (10 points difference of 2 points).
- Each doubles match will operate on the same system as the Singles matches except at 40-40, pairs will play the deciding point with the receiver's choice. In the group, if 2 or more players have the same number of points, then the winner will be decided by the following in this order:
 - a. Head to Head Games
 - b. Game difference between all 4 players
 - c. Game difference between all 3 best players.
- The first and second day of the tournament there is going to be one assistant referee outside of every court in order to detect and solve any issue between the players. In Semi-Finals and Finals there must be a chair umpire for every match.
- Application of let rules: If a ball hits the net before bouncing into the correct service box the play continues.
- It is the responsibility of both players to keep the score of their match.
- All the players must be in the venue 50 minutes before the designated fixture in compliance with ITF rules and the clauses included in the ICG Sports Rules.

3. COMPETITION RULES

- Draws shall be conducted by the Sport Chair and the Referee, and published and disseminated with the assistance of the competition management personnel.
- The Competition Management personnel shall occupy at least three tables along one side of the gym at floor level. They shall check players in, process and announce matches, produce and disseminate updated results, maintain match card and ball inventory control, answer inquiries, guard prizes and assist in their awarding, and produce final results and statistics.
- Each city may enter a maximum 2 boys and 2 girls (4) and a minimum of 1 boy and 1 girl (2).
- One coach per city is allowed.
- Tables: 8 tournament-quality tables(TARGO K-STAR) and nets
- Balls: White 40mm tournament-quality balls(TARGO 40+)
- Surrounds: Enough top-quality surrounds to meet the RIC court dimension
- Glueing: Players needing to glue or re-glue their bats shall do so only in the outdoor area designated for the purpose.

4. COMPETITION RULES

- Rules in Effect: International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) Regulations for International Competitions (RIC)
- A total of 64 players are expected (32 boys, 32 girls); they shall be divided into eight groups.
- All the players must be in the venue 50 minutes before the designated fixture.
- All matches shall be best 3 out of 5 games; games shall be scored on the 11-point system.

5. PRELIMINARY ROUNDS

- A city enters a maximum of 5 boys and 5 girls, and a minimum of 1 boy and 1 girl.
- Only one athlete per team may compete in a particular weight category.
- One coach per city is allowed.

4. TEAM COMPETITION

- For boys the following weight categories apply:
 - Under 45, 48, 51, 55, 59, 63, 68, 73, 78, 78+ (kg)
 - For girls the following weight categories apply:
 - Under 42, 44, 46, 49, 52, 55, 59, 63, 68, 68+ (kg)
- Note. Number of weight categories is subject to change according to the total number of registered athletes.

5. COMPETITION RULES

- The competition will take place according to WTF Rules and ICG Rules.
- Single elimination tournament for each weight class.
- Competition adapts the round system.
- The duration of the contest shall be three rounds of two minutes each, with a one-minute rest period between rounds. In case of tie score after the completion of the 3rd round, a 4th round of two minutes will be as the golden point round, after a one-minute rest period following the 3rd round.

KPNP trunk PSS and head PSS will be used.

 - Equipment used and clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in competition must comply with the rules and regulations of WTF.
 - Wearing any item on the head other than the head protector shall not be permitted. In the case of previously approved religious item, it shall be worn beneath the head protector and inside the dobok, but shall not cause harm or obstruct the opposing contestant.
 - All contestants will participate at their own risk. Under no circumstances can the organization be held responsible for any loss or damage to individuals.
 - All contestants must be in the venue 50 minutes before the designated fixture to receive protector equipment check.
